

What Do I Need To Do?

Grade 9 - □ Verify with your college/career advisor and the online core-course listing to make sure you are on track.

Grade 10 - □ Verify with your college/career advisor and the online core-course listing to make sure you are on track.

Grade 11 - □ Register with the eligibility center. □ Make sure you are still on course to meet core-course requirements (verify you have the correct number of core courses and that the core courses are on your high school's 48-H with the eligibility center). □ After your junior year, have your school registrar send a copy of your transcript. □ If you have attended any other high schools, make sure a transcript is sent to the eligibility center from each high school. □ When taking the ACT or SAT, request test scores to be sent to the eligibility center (the code is "9999"). □ Begin your amateurism questionnaire.

Grade 12 - □ When taking the ACT or SAT, request test scores to be sent to the eligibility center (the code is "9999"). □ Complete amateurism questionnaire and sign the final authorization signature online on or after April 1 if you are expecting to enroll in college in the fall semester. (If you are expecting to enroll for spring semester, sign the final authorization signature on or after October 1 of the year prior to enrollment.) □ Have your high school registrar send a final transcript with proof of graduation to the eligibility center.

□ The courses listed here for each high school are courses that have been determined to meet the NCAA's criteria for a core course. Ask your College/Career Advisor for your school code.

Required Courses & Grade-Point Average

- Only core courses are used in the calculation of the grade-point average.
- **Be sure** to look at your high school's list of NCAA-approved core courses on the Eligibility Center's Web site to make certain that courses being taken have been approved as core courses. The Web site is www.ncaaclearinghouse.net.
- **Division I** grade-point-average requirements are listed on page two of this sheet.
- **Division II** grade-point-average requirement is a minimum of 2.000.
- **PLEASE NOTE:** Beginning August 1, 2013, students planning to attend an NCAA Division II institution will be required to complete 16 core courses.

DIVISION I - 16 Core-Course Rule

- 4 years of English.
- 3 years of mathematics (Algebra I or higher).
- 2 years of natural/physical science (1 year of lab if offered by high school).
- 1 year of additional English, mathematics or natural/physical science.
- 2 years of social science.
- 4 years of additional courses (from any area above, foreign language or non-doctrinal religion/philosophy).

DIVISION II - 14 Core-Course Rule

- 3 years of English.
- 2 years of mathematics (Algebra I or higher).
- 2 years of natural/physical science (1 year of lab if offered by high school).
- 2 years of additional English, mathematics or natural/physical science.
- 2 years of social science.
- 3 years of additional courses (from any area above, foreign language or non-doctrinal religion/philosophy).

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Division II has no sliding scale. The minimum core grade-point average is 2.000. The minimum SAT score is 820 (verbal and math sections only) and the minimum ACT sum score is 68.

14 core courses are currently required for Division II. However, beginning 2013, students will be required to complete 16 core courses.

16 core courses are required for Division I.

The SAT combined score is based on the verbal and math sections only. The writing section will not be used.

SAT and ACT scores must be reported directly to the Eligibility Center from the testing agency. Scores on transcripts will not be used.

Students enrolling at an NCAA Division I or II institution for the first time need to also complete the amateurism questionnaire through the Eligibility Center Web site. Students need to request final amateurism certification prior to enrollment.
